Breakfast

Do you know some typical US American meals? Of course, you have tried a Hamburger, a Hot Dog or a Coke. But that's not all. How about learning a little more about eating and drinking habits in the United States?

We start the morning off with breakfast. By the way, the word 'breakfast' means 'to break the fast', which we do every morning after not eating throughout the night. Usually, Americans do not spend much time and effort on their breakfast at home. Sometimes a bowl of cereals, cornflakes for example, is enough, and a cup of coffee or some orange juice.

As most Americans go to their workplace by car, clever business people everywhere in the country have opened up so-called 'drive-ins'. These are places where you can stop your car, and without leaving it you can buy a cup of coffee and a breakfast snack which is passed to you through the open window.

A typical breakfast is usually eaten at weekends at home or in coffee shops. What does such a breakfast look like? First of all there are 'eggs any style'. That means that you can get your eggs any way you want them: boiled, scrambled or fried, with ham or bacon and toast.

You can also order fruit, and if you feel up to it, a Hamburger, too.

If you like to have a good strong cup of coffee in the morning, you will perhaps be disappointed a little. The coffee you get in American cafeterias or restaurants is very weak. But the compensation is that you pay for one cup only and you can drink as many as you wish.

Well, time is money to many Americans. For this reason the Coca Cola Company started a marketing campaign for their products. Coca Cola has been trying to convince people that a coffee is too hot a drink to go down quickly enough in the morning rush.

Therefore the company recommends to take a cold Coke which goes down really quickly. We don't know if the campaign was successful and people have really changed their breakfast habits.
