(1) Kanata means village or settlement in the language of the Iroquois\*. In 1534 two Iroquois men told the French explorer Jacques Cartier how to travel to "kanata". But they were talking about their village. Cartier later named the whole region Canada. (\* a native tribe)

## Canada - a mosaic of different people

(2) Canada is the world's second-largest country. It has the perfect mix of nature and culture. Only 33 million people live in Canada, but they come from all over the world. They bring their traditions with them and they've got lots of space to live their own way. There are English-speaking Canadians, French-speaking Canadians and aboriginals.

The plastic rubbish bag was invented by Canadian Harry Wasylyk, from Winnipeg, in 1950.



The zipper on your jeans or jacket was invented in Canada by Gideon Sundback in 1913.



The use of insulin to help diabetics was discovered in Canada in 1922 by Frederick Banting and Charles Best.

- One hundred years ago there were about 127,000 aboriginals in Canada. Now there are almost one million.
- Today there are about 5.5 million immigrants in Canada. But all of their children who are born there are automatically Canadian.

### (7) Lacrosse

Have you ever heard of this sport? Some people say lacrosse is the oldest sport in the world, for others it's the fastest one on two feet.

In fact, the first people who played lacrosse were Canada's aboriginals. They played it to honour the "Great Spirit", to thank their god. Later lots of immigrants learned about the game and played it for fun. Soon it was so popular that it became Canada's official sport in 1859. There are four types: field, women's field, box and Inter-Crosse.


